Big Bears:

A super first week back in Big Bears, we have been writing our own rhyming spells and looking at 2D shape patterns in Maths.



Year 1: What a great first week back after half-term! We have focused on adding numbers under 20 in Maths. In English, we are looking at writing a letter to the Queen about why we should be a knight. Also, we have looked at castle defences and what makes a castle wall strong. We then made our own using biscuits and butter icing.



Year 3: Welcome back year 3! We've dived headfirst back into our work tackling some really tricky subtraction questions in our Maths. We've also been doing more descriptive work, but this week we've been specifically looking at settings. We have written some amazing work and let our imaginations go wild! I can't wait to see what amazing places we all get taken to next week! Just a quick reminder, Maths homework and spellings have come home today, with the Maths to be in on Monday.

Year 2: It has been such a lovely start back after the holidays! Year 2 have been very busy over the half term and have built some of the most amazing castles we've ever seen. They have also written stories alongside their castles, which are fantastic! We've taken our learning about castles a little bit further by building castle walls... out of biscuits. We learnt about the structure of the walls and how they were built for strength... and then we discovered how tasty they could be!! In maths we have finally cracked adding two 2-digit numbers and this has made subtracting even easier.

Year 4: Welcome back year 4! We have wasted no time in getting straight back into some excellent work. In Maths we have been investigating times tables and solving multiplication problems. Diary entries have been the focus in writing this week and the children have done really well writing diaries for Stig of the Dump. Our afternoons have concentrated on super heroes and when they were created. We have also looked at coordinates.

Year 5: Welcome back! This week we have been developing our Maths knowledge by learning how to solve the perimeter and area of rectilinear shapes – this proved difficult at first but they never gave up. Within writing we are now taking on the role of Stanley from of our class read (Holes) and learning to write a diary entry about our time on Camp Green Lake which the children loved!



Year 6: What a week back it's been!! Year 6 has sunk straight back onto their routines and are doing so with such pride! We have been mastering the art of algebra in Maths, exploring vocabulary in-depth in reading and have begun writing our letters to Jack. This week has been anti-bullying week and we have had lengthy debates and discussions surrounding the issues.
