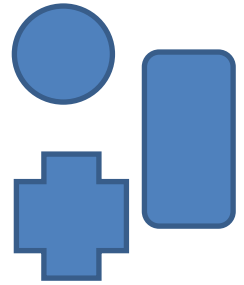

Foundation Stage: This week the Bears have enjoyed getting ready for their Ugly Bug Ball, making decorations and party invitations. Big Bears have started getting ready for year 1 and have been practising their guided reading and longer writing sessions.



Year 1: Welcome back Year 1. I have been amazed by how much effort and success Year 1 have had within Maths this week. We have been splitting shapes and numbers into halves and quarters. The children have also really enjoyed typing up letters to ask for help from others for our festival.



Year 2: It has been a great start to the half term. Year 2 have created some lovely pieces of writing and have loved watching their stimulus 'Something fishy'. I can't wait to see what the final pieces of writing look like. In maths, we have been exploring money and have been adding hundreds.



Year 3: We've had a great start to the new half term. This week in writing the children have been focussing on a setting description and they have come up with some amazing work using adjectives and similes to make their writing even more interesting. In maths we have been using the bar model to assist with our addition and subtraction calculation. The children have worked extremely hard it has truly been difficult to choose a shining star as in my eyes they all deserve it this week.



Year 4: Year 4 have had a great week. In writing, we have been using some brilliant vocabulary and literacy devices to describe a spooky setting; some fantastic work has been produced. In maths, we have been looking at 2D shapes and their symmetrical properties and investigating symmetrical patterns. Within topic, we have been finalising our group work ready for the festival project.



Year 5: Another fabulous week in year five. The children have worked extremely hard on understanding the terminology of regular and irregular polygons. Along with working extremely hard on their problem solving skills relating to addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Within curriculum, we have focused on developing their research skills and collaborative skills towards our festival work. In writing, we have started to develop our setting descriptions on the following picture.



Year 6: Welcome back Year 6. It's been lovely to see everyone come back into school looking rested and refreshed. In writing this week, we have been drafting balanced arguments on the topic 'should school uniforms be compulsory in schools?' We have worked hard to think about thoughtful and powerful opinions on both sides of the argument then write it using a range of appropriate conjunctions, punctuation and our non-negotiables.
