<p>Through monitoring and evaluation the academy recognises the positive impact on the quality of the teaching of PE and the need to use our funding further in 2018/2019 to continue and sustain progress in the provision of sport and PE.</p> <p>Having already seen impact of the funding from the previous 5 years we hope for this additional funding to have continued and sustained impact on the provision in PE and sport within our academy. Learning walks, lesson observations and monitoring by SLT and the Deep Experience Lead, have identified several areas to address in PE this year.</p> <p>Over the past 5 years we have used sports funding to purchase a sports partnership package with De Lacy Academy. This year we will be adding Premier Sports Coaching to the CPD program to further accelerate impact and broaden each child's exposure to different sports. PE specialists will work alongside our teachers to develop their skills and knowledge to enhance the quality of the teaching. In expanding the number of PE specialists we will be able to provide a wider range of sporting activities for the children to develop and experience. In order to sustain and develop further impact the academy will invest in high quality resources to support PE and sport through the curriculum, break times, clubs and competitions with other schools in the local community. Throughout all PE and sport practice children and will be encouraged pupils to continue to lead healthy lifestyles though an enjoyment of physical activity. Staff and the PE specialists will develop an interschool competition timetable with other schools in the local area.</p>
